



2006 STC Phoenix International Technical Writing Competition

Purpose

The Phoenix Chapter of the Society for Technical Communication (STC) sponsors the International Technical Writing Competition (ITWC) to recognize excellence in technical communication at the college level. The competition promotes the development of technical writing skills and publicly recognizes outstanding technical writing ability in college students.

STC is an individual membership organization dedicated to advancing the arts and sciences of technical communication. Some of the primary goals of the Society are to promote the professional development of its members and provide recognition and awards.

The competition winning entries will be published in the Phoenix Chapter newsletter, the *Rough Draft*, and made available for publishing in other STC publications.

Objectives

- ◆ Encourage academic development and technical writing skills.
- ◆ Recognize college-level technical writing skill.
- ◆ Enhance the marketability of winners when they graduate.

Eligibility

Entrants

- ◆ Must be enrolled in a college or university when articles are written.

Articles

- ◆ Must be authored by an individual. No jointly-authored articles are permitted.
- ◆ Must be original and not have been published previously.
- ◆ Must be written between July 1, 2004 and February 28, 2006.
- ◆ Must be written while the entrant was a student.
- ◆ Multiple articles can be submitted by an entrant. A separate entry form must be filled out for each article.

Topic

- ◆ Any subject in technical communication.
- ◆ Must be written for a non-technical audience.
- ◆ Must be at least 800 words in length, but not more than 15 pages.

Submission

Entries must be submitted in electronic format (Word or PDF). Each article must be accompanied by an entry form. Send entries to: Tom Barnett, tpbarnet@srpnet.com.

Schedule

Entries must be received by February 28, 2006.

Judging should be completed and winners announced by the end of March 2006.

Judging

The competition manager will select a minimum of three judges. Judges will be technical writers of proven ability, or academics in the field, and active members of STC. Ideally, one judge must be from the Phoenix STC Chapter, and the other judges must be from outside the Phoenix.

The selection of the winner will be through consensus judging. All decisions will be final. The Phoenix Chapter reserves the right not to declare winners at its discretion.

Copyrights

Entrants retain copyright ownership of their articles. However, winners grant the Society for Technical Communication the non-exclusive right to publish those articles, in print and electronically, in other STC publications.

2. Tone: Does not inject unsubstantiated or ineffective persona or tone.					
3. Purpose: Thesis of entry is clearly stated.

5. Organization: Structure of the entry is clear; conclusions are adequately supported.					
6. Style: Uses direct, precise, and economical language appropriate for the medium, purpose, and audience.					
7. Grammar: Free from or few mechanical, grammatical, or editing errors.*					
8. References, Resources: Uses references, footnotes, bibliographies, citations appropriated; attributes all sources.					
9. Document Design: Page layout and design, with appropriate use of visual arrangement to support readability and usability.					
10. Graphics: Use of graphics that support user's aesthetic value, and clarity of graphics and images.
